

The practice has emerged as a valuable part of the addiction recovery process and has been validated in scientific studies. Priest and recovering alcoholic, Father Bill W. offers detailed, step-by-step instructions as well as sample writings that demonstrate how practical, intimate, and transforming this type of prayer can be. At the heart of the practice, there is dedicated morning devotion and quiet time, where a person asks for spiritual guidance, pauses and listens for the answer, and begins writing down the guidance that is received. It is this practical approach to prayer through listening and writing that provides a spiritual awakening, since any guidance received must be carried into action as a way to be of service. Readers will be shown how the practice can be shared and how it will comfort and guide them one day at a time as they embark on a deeper and more transformative phase of their recovery journey.

Father Bill W. is an Episcopal priest who has been in recovery since 1972. He has served as a counselor and administrator of several nationally recognized addiction treatment centers, including Sacred Heart Rehabilitation Center in Detroit, Michigan, Baton Rouge General Hospital Chemical Dependency Unit, and Cottonwood Treatment Centers in Tucson, Arizona. He has taught as adjunct faculty lecturing on addiction and spirituality at the University of Texas School of Social Work, the Seminary of the Southwest, and Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. He was a fellow in residence at the Hope and Healing Institute in Houston, Texas. He hosts the Father Bill W. podcast and workshops on meaningful recovery. He lives near Austin, Texas.






A happy relationship is not guaranteed even if you are fortunate enough to find the right person.

Leadership in a Shrinking Church

Finding New Vision in Unlikely Places

William H. Harrison

Theological and practical reflections on demographic change in the church.

Numerous churches are contending with the challenges posed by declining membership and attendance. While these trends have most recently been ascribed to the COVID-19 pandemic, the trajectory predates the pandemic and is likely to continue beyond it. William Harrison takes the perspective that demographic decline is merely a reality, rather than a failure to be resolved with new strategies, and examines the theological and ecclesiological questions posed by a shrinking church.

In theological and practical reflections, Harrison examines the twin crises of identity and leadership facing the church, arguing that in response to demographic change, churches must renew their outward focus on evangelism and service. These characteristics of a diaconal church are rooted in sacramental life and self-understanding in a sacramental world. At the same time, leaders must find ways to support these activities while managing decline. *Leadership in a Shrinking Church* connects theological reflection to mission by identifying some of the challenges presented by decline and connecting them to productive responses.

William Harrison is president of Lutheran Theological Seminary, Saskatoon. He is a priest in the Anglican Church of Canada and rostered pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada. He has both taught and served in leadership roles with the College of Emmanuel and St. Chad and the Kootenay School of Ministry. Dr. Harrison has served in diocesan roles with the Anglican Dioceses of Kootenay and Huron and in parish ministry. His PhD is in systematic theology, from Boston College, with a dissertation on Richard Hooker's ecclesiological method. He has an MA in English literature from the University of British Columbia, a BTh from University of Ottawa/St. Paul University, an Honours BA in Political Science from Carleton University, and a Professional Leadership Certificate from the University of Regina. He lives in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.
